Recover Your Wi-Fi Password

Computer users often seek technical support when they are unable to access the Internet via their home wireless system.

First, the technician will usually walk the user through the reset procedure for the router or router/modem (turn them off and on). If that does not fix the problem and it is

determined the router is putting out a good signal the subsequent conversation often goes something like this:

Technician: What is your password for your router?

User: I don't have a password.

Technician: If your router is not secured (i.e. password protected) you should be able to connect to it.

User: I don't have a password. I just click on the Google (or another browser) icon and get online.


At this point, the Technician explains to User that the Wi-Fi password is stored on User's computer and that a few steps are required to access that password. The technician might guide the user through a process to recover the password using the following procedure.

If the computer connects to the Wi-Fi automatically

With the latest version of Windows 10, Microsoft has buried the Wi-Fi password on a computer more deeply than with prior versions of Windows. You can still find your Wi-Fi password using the following procedure:

Find your way to the "Wireless Properties"


Right-click on the Internet access icon on the right side of your Taskbar then click on "Open Network and Internet Settings." Click on "Status" then click on "Network and Sharing Center."



Under "Internet" click on your network name (in blue) then click on "Wireless Properties." Under "security" you can see the hidden password after you click on "show characters."

If you only own a smartphone/tablet or have a PC which has not stored the Wi-Fi password

Log in to your router as an administrator. You can access your router by entering its IP address into your browser, such as Google Chrome or Microsoft Edge. You can



research the default IP address of your router by Googling “IP address [brand name of your router]”. Every router I’ve dealt with had an address of “192.168.X.Y.” The most common value for both X and Y is the number 1. If that does not work, try substituting the numbers 0 or 2 for X.

After you’ve logged in, you should be able to find the Wi-Fi settings on the Administrative pages of your router. There you can look up your Wi-Fi password.

If you are like many people

The Wi-Fi password is written on a sticker on the back of your router. This is how I usually set up home routers and it might be a good thing to do after you have recovered your Wi-Fi password.

This is a simple but effective strategy since it is so easy to find.

A burglar would have to break into your home to steal your password, and they probably would focus on more tangible items.

Dennis mentioned that members receive a \$5 renewal credit for each new member they bring in.

Program: “Removing Crapware from a New PC” by Dennis Smith. Dennis recorded the meeting, and it will be posted on our Facebook page, CAMUG Users Group. He will also post the PowerPoint presentation on our new website which will be going live soon.

- The presentation covered removing crapware from any PC, not just a new one.
- New PCs have added programs which are not needed, called crapware.
- Dennis listed several methods of removing this crapware. These programs must be downloaded and installed.
- For a new PC just out of the box, Dennis showed how to use Windows 10 Fresh Start. He uses RevoUninstall the most.

More Discussion:

- Madeline asked how to show a PowerPoint presentation during a Zoom meeting. She was using a tablet. This led to a discussion that Zoom works differently on PCs, Chromebooks, tablets, and smart phones.
- To find your version of Zoom: On a PC, click the green shield in the upper left corner of the screen, then Statistics. The latest version is 5.2.3; it can be installed and updated with Ninite.
- The group explored video settings, especially video filters that add many special effects to the screen: hats, mustaches, screen borders, etc.
- Tim uses the Snipping Tool to capture part of the screen. Dennis was using PrtSc (print screen) which saves the whole screen to his OneDrive.
- Carol and Dave showed their new rescue dog. Carol also described flying to San Diego on Southwest Airlines.

Adjournment: Carol Joliat moved to adjourn the meeting. Alice Lungociu seconded the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 8:29 PM.
